PRPD Board of Directors Meeting

December Highlights

Paradise, CA, January 2, 2024 – The Paradise Recreation and Park District (PRPD, District) Board of Directors (Board, BOD) conducted its Regular Monthly Meeting on Wednesday, December 13, 2023, at the Terry Ashe Recreation Center.

Staff updated the Board on the current state of the Paradise on Ice Rink, including maintenance and equipment challenges. Staff also apprised the Board of the PRPD statement to the public about the changes to the Rink, and the response from the public during the first month of the Rink Season. The Board will revisit the discussion over the Glice Synthetic Rink at the January Regular Monthly BOD Meeting.

Monica Nolan of the Paradise Ridge Chamber of Commerce gave a special presentation on the results of the Outreach Survey that asked the public how best to attract new residents to the Ridge. The Chamber will be releasing the “Welcome to the Ridge” website soon.

The Board approved a new agreement with Kelly Munson of Chico State for assistance and support for the Elements Grant. The Elements Grant continues to provide access to at-risk youth for community involvement in relation to the outdoors and nature.

New Board officers for the upcoming calendar year were elected by the Board members. Elected were Director Robert Anderson to Board Chairperson, Director Jen Goodlin to Vice-Chairperson, and Director Steve Rodowick to Board Secretary.

The next Regular Board of Directors Meeting will be held at the Terry Ashe Recreation Center on January 10, 2024, at 6:00 pm.
