## PRPD Board of Directors Meeting

### January Highlights

Paradise, CA, January 19, 2024 – The Paradise Recreation and Park District (PRPD, District) Board of Directors (Board, BOD) conducted its Regular Monthly Meeting on Wednesday, January 10, 2024, at the Terry Ashe Recreation Center.

Recreation Supervisor Jeff Dailey presented the annual Pool Report, highlighting activities, revenue and costs, and community usage of both the Paradise and Concow Pools. Notable highlights included the pool heater improvements, additional lifeguards allowing for more classes and increased hours, and the popularity of the Aqua Aerobics classes.

In other District news, the Board approved hiring a grant management consultant (Arbuckle Consulting) to support District grant compliance and reporting, which allows Staff to focus on other projects.

The Board approved a Contractor Short List to utilize pre-approved professional services for District projects.

A Representative from Meeder Investments also made a presentation to Board Directors on updates related to the District's investments .

The next Regular Board of Directors Meeting will be held at the Terry Ashe Recreation Center on February 14, 2024, at 6:00 pm.
