PRPD Board of Directors Meeting

July Highlights

Paradise, CA, July 19, 2023 – The Paradise Recreation and Park District (PRPD, District) Board of Directors (Board, BOD) conducted its Regular Monthly Meeting on Wednesday, July 12, 2023 at Terry Ashe Recreation Center.

Staff member Eddie Valadez made a special presentation on the progress of the Natural Resources Agency Elements Program. The Elements program provides outdoor opportunities, leadership, and work skills training for youth in our community.

The Paradise Community Village was given a loan in 2011 from PRPD for development of recreational features and opportunities at their site in South Paradise. Due to various setbacks, the Board approved an amendment to the Promissory Note for the Paradise Community Village (PCV) to extend to December 2025.

The Board approved an updated 2023-2024 Pool Use Agreement with the Paradise Unified School District. The Paradise High School swim team uses the Paradise Pool facilities during the school year.

Staff presented updates to the PRPD Injury and Illness Prevention Plan, including the PRPD Emergency Action Plan, and also an increase in medical allowances for full-time employees to the Board for approval. Both recommendations were approved by the Board.

The next Regular Board of Directors Meeting will be held at Terry Ashe Recreation Center on August 9, 2023, at 6:00 pm.
